SUBJECT: DETERMINATION ON THE SUITABILITY OF DREDGED MATERIAL EVALUATED UNDER PSDDA GUIDELINES FOR THE LAKE FOREST PARK CIVIC CLUB PROJECT (93-2-001531) FOR DISPOSAL AT THE PSDDA ELLIOTT BAY OPEN WATER DISPOSAL SITE.

1. The Lake Forest Park Civic Club proposes to dredge up to 480 cubic yards of sediments from its pier area in Lake Washington. The following summary reflects the PSDDA agencies' (Corps of Engineers, Department of Ecology, Department of Natural Resources¹ and the Environmental Protection Agency) consensus determination on the suitability of this material for disposal at the PSDDA Elliott Bay open-water disposal site.
2. The ranking for the project area is "moderate", based on the guidance provided in the PSDDA Management Plan Report (MPR), Phase II (page A-11) for Lake Washington (except Kenmore). There are no known conditions in the area which would alter this ranking.
3. The "no test" volume for a moderate-ranked area is 500 cubic yards (MPR Phase II, p. A-13). The proposed dredging volume is less than the "no test" limit. Therefore no testing was required of this project.
4. The PSDDA agency consensus is that all 480 cubic yards of material proposed for dredging from the Lake Forest Park Civic Club (93-2-001531) are suitable for disposal at the Elliott Bay open-water disposal site.
5. This memorandum documents the suitability of proposed dredged sediments for disposal at a PSDDA open-water disposal site. It does not constitute final agency approval of the project. A public notice will be issued for this project. During the public comment period which follows a public notice, the resource agencies will provide input on the overall project. A final decision will be made after full consideration of agency input, and after an alternatives analysis is done under section 404 (b)1 of the Clean Water Act.






