continue to be mailed to our main office in Seattle at the address above. We strongly encourage applicants to include in their application package a CD/DVD containing all permit application materials, including (as applicable) the JARPA, wetland delineation, biological assessment/evaluation, cultural resource report, mitigation plan, and project drawings. Electronic versions of these documents can expedite the application review process and facilitate required coordination with other regulatory and natural resource agencies. Due to e-mail size limitations in our system, we do not recommend e-mailing your application package to us.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Seattle District regulates activities in waters of the United States, including wetlands, throughout the State of Washington under the authority of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act, Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899, and Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act.
