Interested parties are hereby notified that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) have received an application to perform work in waters of the United States as described below and shown on the enclosed drawings dated August 25, 2014.

The Corps will review the work in accordance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA). Ecology will review the work pursuant to Section 401 of the CWA, with applicable provisions of State water pollution control laws.

<u>LOCATION</u>: The proposed project is located in Lake Scanewa, an impoundment of the Cowlitz River at River Mile 88.5, at 1378 Fall Road, near Randle, Lewis County, Washington.

<u>WORK</u>: The proposed project consists of modifications to the existing Cowlitz Falls Dam to improve downstream passage and collection of juvenile salmonids. The entrance structure will include the excavation of no more than 1,570 cubic yards of lake bed and placement of 870 cubic yards of concrete fill waterward of the ordinary high watermark (OHWM). In addition, a temporary cofferdam (250 cubic yards of concrete fill) will be constructed waterward of the OHWM.

Other in-water work will occur but because the other work only consists of the installation of structures and does not involve the discharge of dredged or fill material into a non-navigable water, a Department of the Army permit is not required. These activities include: placement of a sheetpile cofferdam, a trashrack, bulkhead gate, and a pit tag detection device to track fish as they are routed into the Collector Structure. The project would also include the placement of a behavior guidance system and a debris barrier.

Upland work located within the permit area includes: construction of a Collector Structure within the existing dam: construction of a 300-foot-long soldier pile retaining wall downstream of the dam; development of a new access

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road; reconfiguring the existing Cowlitz Falls Fish Facility; installation of the Tailrace Discharge System; stabilization features added to the right gravity section of the Cowlitz Falls Dam to support the dam where the Entrance Structure and Pumpback Diffuser System have been added; and construction of an access road upstream of the dam to service the Pumpback Diffuser System.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To improve fish passage as required by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) issued Cowlitz River Hydroelectric Project License, Article 1.

MITIGATION: The project is required mitigation in the FERC license for the Cowlitz Hydroelectric Project.

ENDANGERED SPECIES: The Endangered Species Act (ESA) requires federal agencies to consult with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) and/or U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) pursuant to Section 7 of the ESA on all actions that may affect a species listed (or proposed for listing) under the ESA as threatened or endangered or any designated critical habitat. The FERC, as the lead agency for ESA consultation, will consult with the NMFS and/or the USFWS as required under Section 7 of the ESA.

ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT: The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, as amended by the Sustainable Fisheries Act of 1996, requires all Federal agencies to consult with the NMFS on all actions, or proposed actions, permitted, funded, or undertaken by the agency, that may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH). The proposed action would impact EFH in the project area. The FERC, as the lead agency for a determination regarding EFH, will consult with the NMFS if necessary.

<u>CULTURAL RESOURCES</u>: The Corps has reviewed the latest published version of the National Register of Historic Places, lists of properties determined eligible and other sources of information. The FERC, as the lead agency for determining compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, will consult with the State Historic Preservation Officer and Native American Tribes as appropriate. The Corps invites responses to this public notice from Native American Tribes or tribal governments; Federal, State, and local agencies; historical and archeological societies; and other parties likely to have knowledge of or concerns regarding historic properties and sites of religious and cultural significance at or near the project area. After receipt of comments from this public notice, the Corps will evaluate potential impacts and consult with the State Historic Preservation Officer and Native American Tribes in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as appropriate.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING</u>: Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Requests for public hearings shall state, with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing.

<u>EVALUATION</u> – <u>CORPS</u>: The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts, of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, considerations of property ownership, and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps is soliciting comments from the public; Native American Nations or tribal governments; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for the work. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species,

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historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the activity.

The described discharge will be evaluated for compliance with guidelines promulgated by the Environmental Protection Agency under authority of Section 404(b)(1) of the CWA. These guidelines require an alternatives analysis for any proposed discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States.

SOURCE OF FILL MATERIAL: The source of the fill material will be a preformed concrete structure.

<u>EVALUATION</u> – <u>ECOLOGY</u>: Ecology is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, Native American Nations or tribal governments, State, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this activity. Ecology will be considering all comments to determine whether to certify or deny certification for the proposed project.




