Interested parties are hereby notified that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) have received an application to perform work in waters of the U.S. as described below and shown on the enclosed drawings dated March 3, 2017.

The Corps will review the work in accordance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA). Ecology will review the work pursuant to Section 401 of the CWA, with applicable provisions of State water pollution control laws and the Coastal Zone Management Act.

LOCATION: In wetlands adjacent to Bear Creek at Bellingham, Whatcom County, Washington.

WORK: Fill 1.37 acres of wetlands to construct 3,200 feet of new roadway.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: Provide arterial traffic facilities to reduce traffic on Bakerview Road and provide access to proposed developments in the area.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: The applicant proposes to fill 1.37 acres of palustrine forested Category II, III, and IV wetlands for construction of 3,200 feet of new roadway (Mahogany Avenue) between Northwest Drive and Pacific Highway. The proposed project would include roadway construction, installation of sidewalks, curb and gutter, and a culvert replacement. Gravel base would be used to fill wetland areas and create the proposed roadway. Retaining walls would be used to minimize impacts to wetlands and Bear Creek. An 18-inch pipe culvert at Bear Creek would be replaced with an 18-foot-wide box culvert. Two feet of streambed aggregate

would be placed in the culvert and a small section of the channel downstream. A gravel bag cofferdam and bypass pipe would be placed in order to isolate the work area from the remainder of the channel. A pump would be used to dewater the work area and any fish present will be relocated downstream. Temporary sediment and erosion controls would be used during construction to protect downstream waters. Post construction stormwater treatment will be provided at the adjacent regional stormwater pond. NOTE: Ancillary to the work requiring Corps authorization, the applicant proposes to widen Northwest Drive north and south of the proposed Mahogany Street intersection, install a traffic signal at the intersection of Northwest Drive and Mahogany Avenue, and install a sewer line along Northwest Drive to Bakerview Road as well as under Mahogany Avenue.

<u>MITIGATION</u>: As compensation for wetland impacts, the applicant proposes to use of an excess 3.21 acres of wetland creation area constructed in conjunction with the North End Regional Pond Project (Corps reference number NWS-2013-1115). This mitigation area is off-site in close proximity to Bear Creek, downstream of the project area.

ENDANGERED SPECIES: The Endangered Species Act (ESA) requires federal agencies to consult with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) and/or U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) pursuant to Section 7 of the ESA on all actions that may affect a species listed (or proposed for listing) under the ESA as threatened or endangered or any designated critical habitat. The Federal Highways Administration, as the lead agency for ESA consultation, will consult with the NMFS and/or the USFWS as required under Section 7 of the ESA if necessary.

ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT: The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, as amended by the Sustainable Fisheries Act of 1996, requires all Federal agencies to consult with the NMFS on all actions, or proposed actions, permitted, funded, or undertaken by the agency, that may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH). The proposed action would impact EFH in the project area. The Federal Highways Administration will consult with the National Marine Fisheries Services if necessary.

<u>CULTURAL RESOURCES</u>: The Federal Highways Administration, as the lead agency for determining compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, will consult with the State Historic Preservation Officer and Native American Tribes as appropriate.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Requests for public hearings shall state, with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing.

<u>EVALUATION</u> – <u>CORPS</u>: The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts, of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, considerations of property ownership, and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps is soliciting comments from the public; Native American Nations or tribal governments; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this

activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for the work. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the activity.

The described discharge will be evaluated for compliance with guidelines promulgated by the Environmental Protection Agency under authority of Section 404(b)(1) of the CWA. These guidelines require an alternatives analysis for any proposed discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the U.S.

<u>SOURCE OF FILL MATERIAL</u>: The applicant stated that fill used for the project would be gravel and dirt from a commercial source.

<u>EVALUATION</u> – <u>ECOLOGY</u>: Ecology is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, Native American Nations or tribal governments, State, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this activity. Ecology will be considering all comments to determine whether to certify or deny certification for the proposed project.

<u>ADDITIONAL EVALUATION</u>: The project is outside the City of Bellingham's Shoreline Management Program jurisdictional area.




















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





BEAR CREEK OHW IMPACTS - PROFILE


