

Vicinity Map

the vicinity map must show both the general and specific location of the proposed project. the vicinity map you provide will be printed in any public notice that is issued, and used by the corps of engineers and other reviewing agencies to locate the site of the proposed activity. please include sufficient details to locate the site from land, and if applicable, from water. you may use an existing road map or u.s. geological survey topographic (scale 1:24,000) as the vicinity map. identify major roads, existing structures, landmarks and adjacent property uses. identify the source of the map or chart from which the vicinity map was taken and, if not already shown, add the following:

- location of activity site (draw an arrow showing the exact location of the site on the map).
 - latitude and longitude.
 - section, township, and range.
 - river mile, if known, for projects on a river.
 - name of nearest waterbody and the name of the larger creek, river, bay, etc., to which the waterbody is an immediate tributary.
 - names, descriptions, and location of landmarks.
 - names of all applicable political jurisdictions such as county, town, city, etc.
 - name of and distance to nearest town, community, or other identifying locations.
 - names or numbers of all roads in the vicinity of the site.
 - street address of site, if applicable.
 - north arrow. orient north towards the top of the page.
 - scale.
