SEATTLE – A public information meeting for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Fish Habitat Restoration project associated with the Howard Hanson Dam Additional Water Supply project will be conducted the evening of July 25 at 7 p.m. at the Federal Center South (4735 East Marginal Way South), the Galaxy Room in Seattle.

The meeting will focus on the status of project objectives, share data relating to the project, and review the timeline for its future.

The Corps' gravel nourishment and engineered log-jam construction project in the Green River, downstream from the Tacoma Public Utilities Diversion Dam, began in August of 2003. Data to date suggests that the project's goals are being met.

At the meeting, representatives from the Corps of Engineers' project management and technical team will be providing operational data, taking comments, and answering questions. Information packets will be provided.

Attendees will have the opportunity to comment on the project; however, this is not a formal public comment meeting.
