

**STATEMENT OF WORK
IRRIGATION AND SOD PLACEMENT @ WILLOW FLATS DAY USE AREA
CHIEF JOSEPH DAM, BRIDGEPORT, WA**


- 1.0** **Project Location:** Chief Joseph Dam, Bridgeport, WA.
- 2.0** **Scope of Work:** Contractor shall provide all labor, equipment and materials (With the exception of those listed as provided by the government Section 4.0) to perform all work required to install an irrigation system and place sod in the vicinity of Chief Joseph Dam as specified herein.
- 1.1** **Existing Conditions:** Existing conditions are favorable and equipment access to the area is good. The work area has been excavated and 14 inches of top soil has been placed. Attached Drawing # 1 shows dimensions of the work area.
- 2.1** **Escorted Site Visit for Bidders:** It is strongly suggested that all bidders arrange for and attend an escorted site visit prior to submitting their bid. Failure to understand the local existing conditions will not be grounds for additional monies. To attend an escorted site visit, contact Laura M. - 2.2** **Pre-construction Conference:** Within fifteen days following award, the Contractor and approved sub-contractor(s) shall attend a preconstruction conference at Chief Joseph Dam. These specifications will be discussed. The Contractor shall submit in writing their work schedule and safety plan at this time. The area where the work will be performed is open year around to fishing and sightseeing. How the work will interface with the current traffic flow and parking will be discussed. The busiest time of the year in this area is mid June through September.
- 3.0** **Irrigation installation and Sod Placement:** The work area has been prepared. Top Soil has been placed within the work area to a depth of 14 inches.
- 3.1** **Supply Line ditch: The irrigation system supply line requires a ditch 24 inches deep by 24 inches wide. The bottom of the ditch shall be filled with bedding material to a depth of 4 inches. Bedding material is supplied by the Government. Length of the supply ditch is approximately 300 feet.**
- 3.2** **Irrigation installation: A detailed drawing showing the system as designed, as well as a magnified view of the same drawing is incorporated in this Statement of Work. An additional sketch of the irrigation system within the 100 by 200 foot lawn area will be provided to the successful offeror. The additional sketch was created for material estimation and will be provided with all pipe and fittings (see 4.0 Government Furnished Materials, below). Any deviation from the incorporated design must have prior written approval by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). Prior to the laying of sod, the irrigation system shall be tested to ensure functionality and proper coverage within the work area.**
- 3.3** **Sod Placement:** The work area shall be hand raked and lightly rolled with a lawn roller to a uniform depth so that the top of the root base of the sod is equal to that of the undisturbed soil around the work area. The sod shall be laid so that the end seams of one strip of sod will not match end seams in adjacent rows. It is the Contractors responsibility to be knowledgeable of, and to comply with the sod vendor's recommendations/requirements for placement and storage of sod. Once the sod is delivered to the Project and accepted by the Government, it then becomes the responsibility of the contractor.
- 4.0** **Government Furnished Materials:** The Government will provide the Contractor all of the fittings, pipe, sprinkler heads, primer and glue necessary to complete the installation of the irrigation system as designed. The Government will also supply the Sod. It will be delivered to the site on a pre-arranged date and time.


If needed for work specified under this contract, non-potable water will be available from a high volume source on the south shore of the dam.

- 5.0** **Protection of Resources:** Environmental pollution is defined as the presence of chemicals/cleaning products, physical or biological elements, or other agents, which adversely affect human health or welfare; unfavorably alter ecological balances; affect other species; or degrade the utility of the environment for aesthetic and recreational purposes. The control of environmental pollution requires consideration of air, water, land, and involves noise and solid waste management as well as any other pollutants. The Contractor and his/her subcontractors shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations concerning environmental pollution control and abatement.
- 6.0** **Waste Disposal:** All waste products generated by the Contractor shall be disposed of in accordance with all Local, State, and Federal laws. This shall include leakage of oils and fuels from all equipment used and/or stored on site during the contract period.
- 7.0** **Measurement for Payment:** Payment for the entire contract amount shall occur upon successful completion, inspection and acceptance by the Government, all work items covered by these specifications.
- 8.0** **Project Duration:** The Contractor shall be given forty-five calendar days from the date they receive their official Notice to Proceed (NTP) to complete the work specified herein. The time given for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises. Commencement of work shall be coordinated with the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR), Laura M. Beauregard at (509) 686-2225. All work shall be performed with a minimal disruption to occupied facilities.
- 9.0** **COR Designation:** Laura M. Beauregard is designated as the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) for this contract. She will be the individual ultimately responsible for insuring contract work is completed as required by the contract requirements. She will certify payments and accept work performed under this contract.

- 10.0** **COTR Designation:** Mark L. Harris is designated as the Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR) for this contract. He will be the primary Government contact for technical questions and contract compliance. He will be responsible for quality assurance and general coordination with the Contractor. - 11.0** **Safety Requirements:** The Contractor shall comply with all applicable OSHA and WISHA Standards as well as current requirements of Corps of Engineers Manual, EM 385-1-1; "Safety and Health Requirements Manual" dated September 1996. A copy of this manual is available for inspection at the Project Office prior to bid opening, and a copy will be given to the successful bidder after award. QSHA & WISHA Standards, and EM-385-1-1 are subject to change and the changes may affect the Contractor in his/her performance during the contract period. It is the Contractors responsibility to be knowledgeable of, and to comply with such changes.
