Interested parties are hereby notified that an application has been received for a Department of the Army permit in accordance with Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of March 3, 1899, for certain work described below and shown on the enclosed drawings.

LOCATION - In Hood Canal, near the confluence of Tahuya River and Hood Canal, in Tahuya, in Mason County, Washington.

WORK - Construction of a pier, ramp, and float, which will extend from the existing bulkhead approximately 100-foot waterward of the mean high water (MHW) line. Work consist of the installation of 4 ammoniacal copper zinc arsenate (ACZA) treated wood piles, 1 ACZA treated wood stub pile, 4-foot by 40-foot fixed pier, 4-foot by 40-foot ramp, and one 8-foot wide by 25-foot long float. The float will have 4-foot wide grating installed down the middle with 60% open area and the stud pile will prevent grounding of the float during low tide.

PURPOSE - Private recreational access to Hood Canal.

ENDANGERED SPECIES - The Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973, as amended, requires assessment of potential impacts to listed and proposed species. The Puget Sound chinook (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*), listed threatened; Hood Canal summer-run chum (*Oncorhynchus keta*), listed threatened; coastal/Puget Sound bull trout (*Salvelinus confluentus*), listed threatened; bald eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*), listed threatened; marbled murrelet (*Brachyramphus marmoratus*), listed threatened, Steller sea lion (*Eumetopias jubatus*), listed threatened; humpback whale (*Eumetopias jubatus*); listed threatened; and leatherback sea turtle (*Dermochelys coriacea*), listed endangered may occur in the proposed project vicinity. For marbled murrelet critical habitat has been designated. A preliminary determination indicates that the activity "may affect", but is not likely to adversely affect" chinook, chum, bull trout, bald eagle, marbled murrelet and have "no effect" on Steller sea lion, humpback whale, and leatherback sea turtle.

ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT - The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (MSA), as amended by the Sustainable Fisheries Act of 1996, requires all Federal agencies to consult with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) on all actions, or proposed actions, permitted, funded, or undertaken by the agency, that may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH). EFH for Pacific salmon, groundfish, and coastal pelagic species occurs in the project area. The proposed action would impact approximately 0.01 acres of EFH for these species. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) has determined that the proposed action will not adversely affect designated EFH for federally managed fisheries in Washington waters. No further EFH consultation is necessary.

CULTURAL RESOURCES - The District Engineer (DE) has reviewed the latest published version of the National Register of Historic Places, lists of properties determined eligible and other sources of information. The following is current knowledge of the presence or absence of historic properties and the effects of the undertaking upon these properties: There are no recorded historic properties within the permit area. The proposed work is of such a limited nature and extent that little likelihood exists for the project to impinge upon an unrecorded historic property. The DE invites responses to this public notice from Federal, Native American Nations or tribal governments, State of Washington (State), and local agencies, historical and archeological societies, and other parties likely to have knowledge of or concerns with historic properties in the area.

PUBLIC HEARING - Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Requests for public hearings shall state, with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing.

EVALUATION - The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact, including cumulative impacts of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, considerations of property ownership, and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, Native American Nations or tribal governments, State, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for the work. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the activity.

ADDITIONAL EVALUATION - The State is reviewing this work for consistency with the approved Washington Coastal Zone Management Program. This proposal is the subject of Shorelines Substantial Development Permit being processed by Mason County.


