ADDITIONAL INFORMATION SUPPORTING NJD: On the Southeast boundary of the subject property is a natural depression in the landscape that would transport runoff during extreme events. This area is not shown on the March 2005 drawings. At the lower end of the depression, the slope lessens, and wetland characteristics emerge at the edge of a pond that was formed by a low dike across the depression. From the pond, the water flows through a culvert that drains into a storm water detention pond located at the Southeast corner of Fairmount Drive and Bishop Boulevard, that has no apparent outlet. This wetland and detention pond system has no surface connection to navigable waters of the United States.
