VIRTUAL PUBLIC OUTREACH EVENT SHELLFISH MARICULTURE (AQUACULTURE) PERMITTING

ANNOUNCEMENT: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Seattle District (Corps) will be holding a Shellfish Mariculture Permitting Virtual Public Outreach Event to be held Tuesday, October 10, 2023, from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.

BACKGROUND: In 2020, a federal court vacated all existing Nationwide Permit (NWP) 48 verifications (~900 projects) in Washington State and required permittees to apply for new authorization if they wanted to continue operating. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers nationwide-enterprise reinforcement team under the command and control of the Seattle District completed the mission between November 2020 – May 2022 when the team evaluated and made permit decisions for all projects affected by the 2017 NWP 48 vacatur. The Seattle District has resumed management of the aquaculture permitting program and staffed accordingly.

<u>PUBLIC OUTREACH EVENT:</u> The Seattle District will be hosting a virtual public outreach event on Shellfish Mariculture permitting in Washington State. A representative of Washington State Department of Ecology Section 401 Water Quality Certification program will also be in attendance.
