

# **PUBLIC NOTICE**

Interested parties are hereby notified that a <u>revised</u> application has been received for a Department of the Army permit in accordance with Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA), for certain work described below and shown on the enclosed drawings dated October 2025. The work was previously described in Public Notice No. NWS-2025-346, dated June 6, 2025. The revision consists of deleting the previously proposal installation of sheet pile scour guard at the lower bulkhead footing and to placement of rock at the base of the structure to protect the footing. A detailed description of the revised project is given below.

LOCATION: In Shilshole Bay at Seattle, King County, Washington.

<u>WORK</u>: Repair approximately 180 linear foot long concrete bulkhead/upland retaining wall.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: Maintain protection for existing upland single-family residence and associated property features.

<u>ADDITIONAL INFORMATION</u>: The applicant proposes to repair the lower portion of a two-tiered, approximately 180-linear-foot-long concrete bulkhead and upland retaining wall. The work involves repairing 12 concrete buttresses and installing rip rap at the toe of the existing concrete footing slab.

Twelve existing concrete triangular-shaped buttresses will be repaired by constructing timber formwork adjacent to each buttress. A new replacement buttress will be cast and poured next to the existing ones. Drilled dowel bars will be installed to tie the new concrete into the existing structure. Approximately 10 inches of new concrete will be placed on at each buttress to structurally reinforce the bulkhead. Approximately 40 cubic yards of light, loose rip rap would be installed in an area approximately 540 square feet at the toe of the existing concrete footing slab to protect the structure from undermining scour.

Best Management Practices and temporary erosion and sediment control (TESC) measures will be implemented for the duration of project activities to minimize potential construction impacts. Work will be completed during low tide in the dry to avoid direct impacts to minimize impacts to beach substate and water quality (via turbidity). All equipment and material staging will occur within upland areas. A spill response kit will be maintained present on-site during completion of project activities. All construction debris will be collected and not allowed to enter waters of the state. All debris generated will be properly disposed of at an approved off-site disposal facility. If debris or spilled material accidentally enters the waterway, immediate actions will be taken to remove the material.

The location of the line of mean high water and the high tide line shown on the project drawings have not yet been verified by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps). If the Corps determines the boundaries of the wetland/waters are substantially inaccurate a new public notice may be published.

MITIGATION: None Proposed.

<u>ENDANGERED SPECIES</u>: The Endangered Species Act (ESA) requires federal agencies to consult with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) and/or U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) pursuant to Section 7 of the ESA on all actions that may affect a species listed (or proposed for listing) under the ESA as threatened or endangered or any designated critical habitat. ESA consultations have been initiated with NMFS and USFWS for the project.

ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT: The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, as amended by the Sustainable Fisheries Act of 1996, requires all Federal agencies to consult with the NMFS on all actions, or proposed actions,

permitted, funded, or undertaken by the agency, that may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH). The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) has determined that the proposed action will not adversely affect designated EFH for federally managed fisheries in Washington waters. No further EFH consultation is necessary.

CULTURAL RESOURCES: The Corps has reviewed the latest published version of the National Register of Historic Places, Washington Information System for Architectural and Archaeological Records Data and other sources of information. There are no recorded historic properties within the permit area. The permit area has been so extensively disturbed by modern development that little likelihood exists for the proposed project to impinge upon an undisturbed historic property. The Corps invites responses to this public notice from Native American Nations or tribal governments; Federal, State, and local agencies; historical and archeological societies; and other parties likely to have knowledge of or concerns regarding historic properties and sites of religious and cultural significance at or near the project area. After receipt of comments from this public notice, the Corps will evaluate potential impacts and consult with the State Historic Preservation Officer and Native American Nations in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as appropriate.

WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION: Section 401 of the Clean Water Act requires applicants proposing any activity that may result in a discharge into waters of the U.S. to provide the Corps with a certification from the jurisdiction in which the discharge originates that the discharge will comply with applicable water quality requirements. The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) is the certifying authority for this activity. The Corps cannot make a final permit decision until Ecology determines the activity would not result in a discharge, grants certification (with or without conditions), waives certification, or fails to act within the reasonable period of time. Conditions may be added to the Corps permit if Ecology determines they are necessary to ensure compliance with the applicable water quality standards.

COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT ACT: The Coastal Zone Management (CZM) Act requires federal permitting agencies to ensure that authorized activities affecting any coastal use or resource are conducted in a manner consistent with the State's approved CZM program. The applicant has provided a certification that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent with the management program. The Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) will evaluate the proposed project for consistency with their enforceable policies and will determine whether they conditionally concur with, concur with, or object to this consistency certification. The Corps cannot make a final permit decision until Ecology concurs with the applicant's certification of consistency. Conditions may be added to the Corps permit if Ecology determines they are necessary to ensure compliance with the CZM program.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Requests for public hearings shall state, with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing.

<u>EVALUATION:</u> The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts, of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, considerations of property ownership, and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Native American Nations or tribal governments; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for the work. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the activity.


COMMENT AND REVIEW PERIOD: Conventional mail or e-mail comments on this public notice will be accepted and made part of the record and will be considered in determining whether authorizing the work would not be contrary to the public interest. In order to be accepted, e-mail comments must originate from the author's e-mail account and must include on the subject line of the e-mail message the permit applicant's name and reference number as shown below. Either conventional mail or e-mail comments must include the permit applicant's name and reference number, as shown below, and the commenter's name, address, and phone number. All comments received will become part of the administrative record and are subject to public release under the Freedom of Information Act including any personally identifiable information such as names, phone numbers, and addresses. All comments whether conventional mail or e-mail must reach this office, no later than the expiration date of this public notice to ensure consideration.





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

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
